LEGAL PROVISIONS FOR FOREIGN ARCHITECTS

In Finland a special professional proficiency test of registration is not required in order to practise as an architect. It is sufficient to have a degree certificate according to the Professional Qualification Directive 2005/36/EC.

The most important legislation controlling land use, spatial planning and construction in Finland is contained in the Land Use and Building Act and the complementing decrees.
