LEGAL PROVISIONS FOR FOREIGN ARCHITECTS

In order to practise the profession of architect in Portugal, registration with the Portuguese Ordem dos Arquitectos is mandatory _ see conditions/requirements [here](#).
Foreigners who are members of the European Union or in a reciprocal situation must hold a diploma in architecture in accordance, with EU Directive 2005/36/EC.
For urban planning operations only, national legislation requires for the creation of multidisciplinary teams, the coordinator of which must be an architect, engineer, urban planner or landscaper.

IMPLEMENTATIONS

European 5

(3 sites) - one winning team signed a contract to develop their project (not built); this same team is currently restarting the process and developing the project for implementation (2025).

European 6

(4 sites) - four winning teams have signed a contract: one is built, one is under construction, the other two have developed urban plans.

European 7

(4 sites) - one winning team signed a contract.

European 8

(5 sites) - four winning teams (the jury decided not to award the prize for one of the sites)
- one winning team signed a contract and developed an urban plan.

European 9

(3 sites) – two winning teams signed a contract.

European 10

(3 sites) – one winning team is currently negotiating the commission and contract.

European 11

(1 site) – one winning team is currently negotiating the commission and contract.

European 12

(2 sites) – for one of the sites, the three awarded teams organised themselves into a consortium, negotiated a commission, signed a contract and developed urban plans.

European 13

(3 sites) – two winning teams are engaged in ongoing commission negotiations.
